WATERWORKS RATE POLICY

The Reserve and Settlement share water and sewage infrastructure. Provincial jurisdiction extends only to those components that are located within the boundaries of the Settlement. Infrastructure that is located on Reserve is under federal jurisdiction.

The main components of the water system are located on Reserve and consist of a lake intake, raw water pumping station, water treatment plant, two underground potable water storage reservoirs, a distribution pump station, and associated works and distribution pipe networks. One of the underground potable water storage reservoirs and a distribution pipe network is located in the boundaries of the Settlement.

The Settlement does not have a rate policy bylaw, as the Reserve directly collects and bills the residents for water consumption.

WATERWORKS CAPITAL INVESTMENT STRATEGY

The objective of the Northern Settlement of Wollaston Lake's investment strategy is to address anticipated waterworks infrastructure maintenance, the immediate drinking water infrastructure problems, and future infrastructure replacements in a timely fashion so as to ensure the settlement provides safe drinking water to residents and businesses. The strategy uses the 2020 waterworks system assessment as required by *The Waterworks and Sewage Works Regulations, 2015* for infrastructure planning and the 2015 Waterworks System Assessment completed by Associated Engineering as required by SaskWater.

To cover the costs of future waterworks infrastructure maintenance and replacements, the settlement will likely need to undertake in the future a combination of increasing water rates to build the waterworks reserves. The capital investment strategy will ensure that safe drinking water can be provided to the residents, businesses, and surrounding rural community in the present and future.
